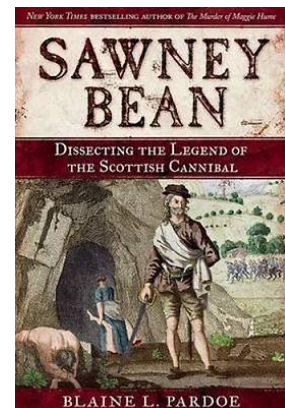

Notes: A short biography of the odious Sawney Bean and his cannibal family. The Sawney Bean family was said to have lived in a cave on the Galloway coast of Scotland, during the reign of James I (1406-37), where they robbed and devoured travelers. Oldham records it as Sawney Beane's Cave in Galloway but mentions that another cave, according to Carrick tradition, Bennan Head Cave, 3.5 miles north of Ballantrae, was the dwelling place of the ogre. This second cave is the one favored by Gracie in his article and Pardoe in his book.
