Gabon in August 1957 by Villy Aellen and Pierre Strinati (both well-known Swiss speleologists), the latter recorded several nature sounds, bird and animal calls, and two native dances. Using a Nagra tape machine and a Labor microphone, Strinati recorded the cries of a colony of Roussette bats (Epomops franqueti) at night in the vicinity of Lastourville. Their harsh cries are emitted at extremely regular intervals as they hang from the trees. These are not cave dwelling bats so technically this recording does not belong in this discography, but bat recordings of any kind are rare.

Villy Aellen was a bat specialist, who was the director at the Muséum d'Histoire Naturelle in Geneva, Switzerland and Pierre Strinati is a biospeleologist who has studied and written about cave fauna the world over. Both men authored the remarkable guide to West European show caves, *Guide des grottes d'Europe occidentale*, in 1975, which has since been published in French, German, Spanish, and Italian.

To learn more about Pierre Strinati it is probably best to go to Google images and click around on the various images showing either the man himself or one of his many books on caves.
