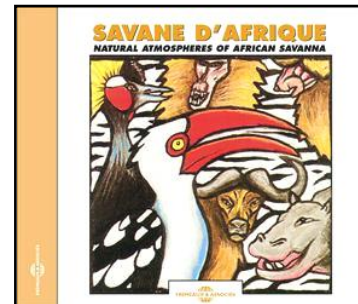

**Notes:** The album of East African animal sounds recorded in the Luangwa Natural Park in Zambia. There



are three tracks for the Epomophorus fruit bat. The 30-second audio samples provided for the first track are groups of short clipped chits, the second track had a series of excited quick chits, and the third track was a very different sounding series of high-pitched squeaks that sounded more like a bird than a bat.

There is a North Luangwa Natural Park and a South Luangwa Natural Park both located in the eastern portion of Zambia west of Malawi. This Zambian postage stamp shows an Epomophorus crypturus or Peters' Epauletted Fruit Bat. This may be the species you are hearing here.
