Notes: Primarily a rockabilly label, which was founded by Joey Welz in 1959. Welz was the featured piano

player with Bill Haley's Comets. He scored his biggest hits on this label with "Boppin' the Stroll" and "The Whistling Piano Man." Terry Telson was a singer-songwriter from Phoenix, Arizona. "The legend begins at Bat records in Baltimore in 1955 with joey's

(sic) first band....the Jay Rockers and then in 1957,,,,the Rockabillies....all recorded at monumental sound on Maryland [ave?] in Baltimore with Wil Taylor engineer and Joey Welz arranging and producing." (Anon. n.d.)
A list of over 12 additional singles was taken from a 2007

compilation CD entitled, "From the Vaults of Bat Records." Note the stylized bat logo shown at the top of the 45 single "The Mystery of Love," which appears on the cover of this CD. No detailed data could be found for these rare Bat singles.

FIRST LABEL DESIGN – The earliest Joey Welz single, Bat 1001, is a black label with the title "Bat Records" in white block letters with the word "Bat" writ large. Over the word "Bat" are two scrolls

joined to form the upper edge of a very simplified stylized bat

SECOND LABEL DESIGN – Starting with Bat 1002 three early Jory Welz singles have a stylized black bat with wings spread and a big round head. At the bottom of the label is printed "Another Fly by Night Recording" and to the left of this notice is a very small bat flying awkwardly.

THIRD LABEL DESIGN – The blue label of Bat 4273 has only the mere outline of a stylized bat with rudimentary eyes that stretches across the 45 spindle hole.

FOURTH LABEL DESIGN – The label of 1990 single by Bat has an extremely stylized thin black bat with folded wings hanging from the top of the label.
