Notes: An adventure comedy, which takes place in a fictional country in Africa. The great white bat is a sacred animal for the tribes and Ace travels to the sacred caves to find this rare endangered bat. "Vincent Cadby wanted control of the bat-inhabited caves owned by the Wachati, since guano (bat feces), the main source of the Wachati way of life, was used in fertilizer, and fertilizer is a \$1.4 billion industry. But, he could never legally take possession of the caves as long as the Wachatis were living in the area, so he had Mick Katie and Gahjii steal the bat to get the Wachati and the Wachootoo to wage war and destroy each other, leaving him free to assume ownership of the caves." (Tornado Dragon n.d.)

The [YouTube](#) film extract shows Jim Carrey with a torch going through the cave (studio set) making a fool of himself, whipping the torch around, throwing things, screaming, and doing the idiot.

The cue is "a suspenseful marriage of the orchestra and exotic wind instruments. The didgeridoo and shakahachi become the eerie interior of the Sacred Animal's cave, the music's percussion rising with Ventura's bat-phobia." (Liner notes)

Notes: A Peter Sellers comedy where he plays. Peter Sellers plays Aldo Vanucci (aka the Fox), one of the greatest criminals of the world and master of disguise. He poses as an Italian movie named Federico Fabrizi.

This cue, "Grotta Rosa," was not used in the film. It's "one of several Italian dance pastiches that make up the balance of the score." (Dominic 2003)

The music is a gay waltz with an Italian-Tyrolian flavor. The cut on the original LP was only 1:19 long, but the CD provided 3:53 running time.

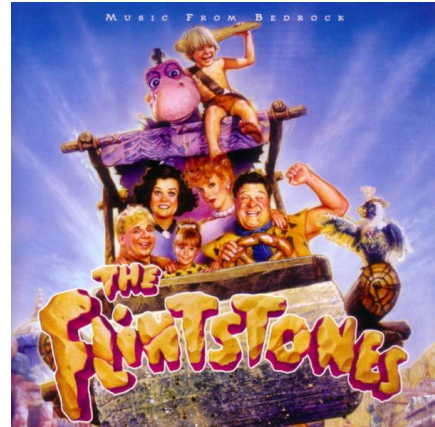
Notes: None of these five rock songs were used prominently in the soundtrack, with the exception of "The Bedrock Twitch" by The BC-52's, which was used for the nightclub dance scene, but this one can only be considered to be of marginal interest. Four of these songs will be treated separately in the section on rock music (see under Rock Music – [Rock 'n' Roll](#); Hip-Hop; Folk Rock; & Disco) and the fifth, "The Bedrock Twitch," will be found in the Marginal Cave Music section.

This CD is basically a compilation of so-called prehistoric caveman rock songs but the nine other songs on the album are not really cave-related. Most of them only relate to the cartoon story of the Flintstones and their community, which is really nothing more than a modern middle-class parody of prehistoric life in aboveground cave-like homes.

Two songs (Tks 2 & 3 on the CD) have nothing to do even with the Flintstones. There are many categories of rock here: twist, reggae, punk rock, disco, two rap songs – a little bit of everything to appeal to the widest audience. The last selection (Tk 13) is a long orchestral cue "Mesozoic Music" which again, given the title, is not cave-related.

Nothing specific could be learned about the cave scene.

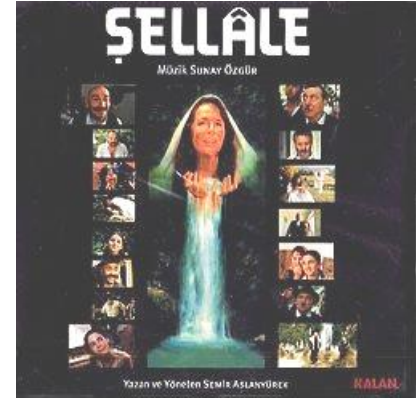
The title of this cue is the Turkish word for “cave.” This is Turkish listening music with voices, a wistful orchestral theme.
