Notes: Arsenio Rodriguez was a very important figure in early Cuban music and his recording career spanned from the early 1930s

to his last LP in 1968. "Between 12 Sept 1940 and 1 July 1958 Arsenio and his conjunto (group) cut 134 sides for Victor. (Johnson 2006) He was born in Guíra de Macurijes in the Matanzas Province, which is a major karst area in Cuba. Due to an accident in his youth he was totally blind. His favored instrument was the Cuban tres, a 6-string instrument, 3 courses of 2 strings, but he also played guitar, bass, conga, maracas, and quinto drum. (Salazar 1994)

At the end of the '30s the mambo was first created by combining the Cuban *danzón* with African rhythms and adding the conga. By the mid '40s Antonio Arcaño and Arsenio Rodriguez "were the most popular bandleaders" in Cuba and both had a major part in "inventing" the mambo. (Salazar 1994)

The natural cave nightclub, Las Cuevas, outside the colonial city of Trinidad, possibly inspired this mambo to the composer, Tata Gutiérrez. This cave nightclub was fully operating in the mid '50s (Anon. 1958) and continues today as the Discoteca Carlos de Ayala. Another Cuban cave nightclub, Cueva del Pirata, a flank margin cave in Varadero, may also have inspired this piece.

In the audio sample you could hear at the end of each stanza, "En la Cueva." For the instrumental bridge there are fine solos on trumpet and piano. An altogether great piece of classic Cuban mambo.

This short piece is only the first part of a six-part potpourri, which includes – La Chambelona, Quitate el Zapato, Yayabo, A la Pelota, & Vamomos, Vamomos.

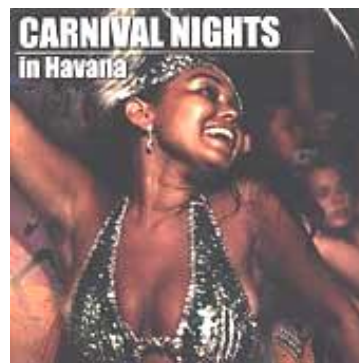
In the 30-second audio clip the phrase "Virgen de la cueva" was heard twice at the start the couplets that were separated by a piercing trumpet riffs and a piano riff.
