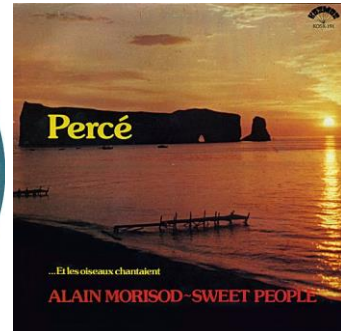
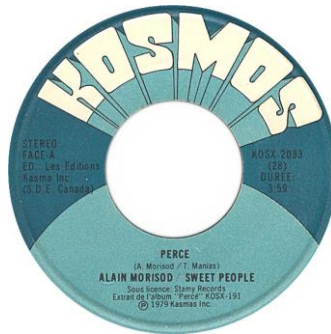
Opening with the sound of breaking sea waves this slow nostalgic piece wanders over the water, then has a ringing electric piano solo.

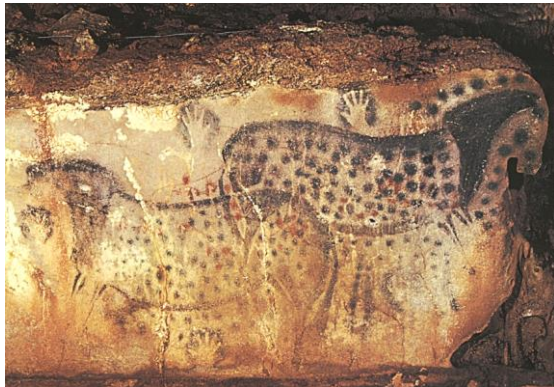

**Notes:** This album of sing-along art appreciation songs about various famous artists from Leonardo da Vinci to Monet to Picasso is recommended for Preschool children through Grade Three. Yurgen Ilaender (Mr. I) studied music in British Columbia and Seattle. He is a



music teacher and performer now living in Maple Ridge, B.C. and he has composed two bat songs, which appeared on another CD (see below).

This particular song tells "a funny story about Gary Q [Gary Huntbatch] going back in time to meet the first 'caveman artist'. The story is based upon the discovery of a 'spotted horse' found in a cave in Dedone' (sic), France. The painting on the cave has been dated back to about 1600 BC." (Anon. n.d.) There is no such town in France as

"Dedone," possibly what is meant is the "Dordogne" department. However, the Paleolithic wall painting of the famous "spotted horse" is only found in the Grotte de Pech Merle at Cabrerets in the Lot department of southwest central France.

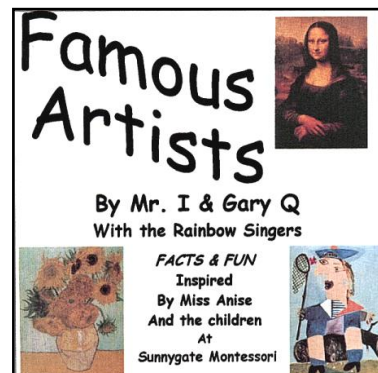

**Notes:** An album of 17 Halloween songs for young children, songs that are “fun but not too scary.” Mr. I is joined by a chorus of young children, The Rainbow Singers. Yurgen Ilaender (Mr. I) studied music in British Columbia and Seattle. He is a music teacher and performer now living in Maple Ridge, B.C. and he has co-composed a song about prehistoric art, which appeared on another CD (see above).

Three of the songs on this album are about bats; the second seems to be an answer song to another children’s song, “Bring Back the Bat,” composed by Nancy Schimmel & Fran Anvi (see [PO-GB&US-CH4](#)), however, none of these songs have been auditioned. The third song, “Ghost Bat,” is not listed by the Mr. I Web site as one of the selections on this CD, but the other two sites do list it.
